





Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Though we be "but dust and ashes," we can presume to draw near and speak boldly to our Lord, as Abraham dares to do in this week's First Reading.

But even Abraham—the friend of God, our father in the faith—did not know the intimacy that we know as children of Abraham, heirs of the blessings promised to his descendants.

The mystery of prayer, as Jesus reveals to His disciples in this week's Gospel, is the living relationship of beloved sons and daughters with their heavenly Father. Our prayer is

pure gift, made possible by the "good gift" of the Father—the Holy Spirit of His Son. It is the fruit of the New Covenant by which we are made children of God in Christ Jesus.

Through the Spirit given to us in Baptism, we can cry to Him as our Father—knowing that when we call, He will answer.

Jesus teaches His disciples to persist in their prayer, as Abraham persisted in begging God's mercy for the innocent of Sodom and Gomorrah.

For the sake of the one just Man, Jesus, God spared the city of man from destruction, "obliterating the bond against us," as Paul says in this week's Epistle.

On the Cross, Jesus bore the guilt of us all. He canceled the debt we owed to God, the death we deserved to die for our transgressions. We pray as ones who have been visited in our affliction and saved from our enemies, as ones who have been spared.

We pray always a prayer of thanksgiving, which is the literal meaning of "Eucharist." We have realized the promise of this week's Psalm: We worship in His holy temple, in the presence of angels, hallowing His name.

In confidence we ask, knowing that we will receive, that He will bring to completion what He has done for us_raising us from the dead, bringing us to everlasting life along with Him.

As of July 18, Sacred Heart was 56.67% towards its goal with 32.34% participation. \$18,230.40 has been donated or pledged. St. Stanislaus was 72.27% towards its goal with 35.29% participation. \$18,115.00 has been donated or pledged. ALL ARE WELCOME to the 103rd Anniversary of the Frank Marynik Wayside Cross! – Please join us there for prayer and celebration! Sunday, July 27, following the 10:30am Mass at St. Stanislaus Church in Warsaw. 12 noon Rosary at the Frank Marynik Wayside Cross (directions below). Picnic to follow - Please bring lawn chairs (food will be provided, including some Polish!). Free will offering for Wayside Cross maintenance and picnic food & supplies. Directions from Warsaw: 5 miles east to County Road 2, 2 miles north, and 1/4 mile east to end of the road. Adorned with an iron statue of the crucified Christ, this wooden wayside cross was inspired in 1922 by Frank Marynik, whose wife was Angeline (Perkerewicz) Marynik. After he shared his experiences with others, a group of his neighbors undertook and completed the original construction and installation of the outdoor shrine. By these actions, they all showed their love of Jesus and their commitments to His teachings. Roadside shrines are a tradition that came over with Polish immigrants as a sign of their dedication of their lands and lives to God!
